#### **Anti-Bullying Week**

Anti-Bullying Week 2022 takes place from Monday 14th - Friday 18th November with the theme. 'Reach Out'. It is coordinated by the Anti-Bullying Alliance, which is based at leading children's charity, the National Children's Bureau. This year they have worked with over 300 children and young people to decide the theme.

Their message is clear: Bullying affects millions of lives every year, but it doesn't have to be this way. If we challenge it, we can change it. And it starts by reaching out. It takes courage, but it can change lives. So, this Anti-Bullying Week, let's come together and reach out to stop bullying.

Odd Socks Day will take place on the first day of Anti-Bullying Week, Monday 14th November to help raise awareness for Anti-Bullying Week. All children are encouraged to wear odd socks!

We will also be raising money for Children in Need on Friday 18th November by encouraging everyone to dress up and drop coins into a bucket. Children are free to dress up any way they would like. Suggestions include favourite characters, something spotty or even dressing up as Pudsey Bear himself!

The School Council is taking the lead on our work for Anti-Bullying Week by leading special assemblies.

If your child usually has a packed lunch and would like to eat the Christmas lunch on 13th December, please let the office know by 1st December.


#### Update from the PSA
