Your child will learn to read in a very simple way.

They will learn to: •Read letters by their 'sounds' •Blend these sounds into words

•Read the words in a story.



First, your child will learn to read:

Set 2 Speed Sounds: long vowels

igh

•Set 1 Speed Sounds: these are sounds written with one letter:

masdtinp gockubfelhrjvywzx

OW OO

Sounds written with two letters (your child will call these 'special friends'): sh th ch qu ng nk ck

ar

or

Set 3 Speed Sounds: ire ear ure

ee

ay

It is important that we use pure sounds, such as 's' not 'suh', so that your child will be able to blend the sounds into words.

Reading Words

Here are some words containing these sounds, we call this sound blending

m-a-t mat c-a-t cat *q-o-t got* f-i-sh fish, s-p-o-t spot b-e-s-t best s-p-l-a-sh splash



We use 'Fred Talk' to help children read and spell words that can be decoded (also known as green words)

Writing Words

When we write words, we use our 'Fred Fingers' to spell them out.

We use sound mats to help the children link sounds to letters.

What can I do at home?

Practise handwriting

Practise sound-writing

- Your child will bring home a new sound 4x a week.
- Practise writing 'm' saying 'Maisie mountain, mountain
- Name each picture 'm' mouse 'm' mountain 'm' mirror
- Spot the sounds whilst reading books and when you're out and about.

Ask your child to read the sounds and words before they read the story.
