Attendance

- We kindly ask parents to check and sign their child's reading record each week. This enables your child to know that we all value their education and encourage them to foster a love for reading.

What is Phonics?

Phonics is a way of teaching children to read quickly and skillfully.

They are taught how to:

- ♦ Recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes
- ♦ Identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make (e.g. /sh/)
- ♦ Blend these sounds together from left to tight to make a word
- ♦ At St Aidan's, we use the Read Write Inc programme





Set 1 sounds

These sounds are introduced in Nursery and taught daily in Reception. The children will begin to learn to blend and segment to help them with reading and spelling. This will begin with simple words

e.g. at, on, am, mat, sit, pot.

at	mad
sad	dad
sat	mat

These sounds are taught in Year 1 and Year 2. The children will blend and segment words with set 3 sounds. Reading teachers will introduce green words with each set 3 sound in class and send them home for children to continue practising.







Phonics Screening Check

What is the Phonics Screening?

- This will take place in the Summer Term
- Children will read a range of real and nonsense words
- They will have opportunities throughout the year to become familiar with the screening and its layout
- We will support throughout the year, teaching sounds they need to know, reading real and nonsense words.



How can I help my child at home?



Your child should read to you their phonics book every day. Encourage them to use their sounds (Fred Talk) to read unfamiliar words.

Ensure you avoid saying the chwa..



Revise green words with the focus sound.



Ensure that you pronounce 'pure' sounds when you practise the sounds with your child at home. We have videos and links on our school website.
